On Thursday, April 28th, three dozen high school students from Ha:sañ Preparatory & Leadership School attended the 3rd annual Environmental Science and Health Youth Conference at the University of Arizona. This year's theme was Global Environmental Leadership and Sustainability. During this day-long event, students participated in group activities and heard from three influential guest speakers.

Between each lecture, students took part in activities that allowed them to reflect on their own carbon footprint and what they can do to start making a positive difference in the environment, such as sorting out all of the recyclables

from a trash pile to learn about the use and wasted space in landfills, ordering lists of items based on decomposition time, and tossing around beach balls with questions written on them to their peers.
